Plaintiff

Experts

The plaintiff will hire an expert to testify about the (alleged) standard of care violations. Your claims consultant and defense counsel will secure their own experts, typically experts in your specialty or related specialty, to assess your care and the plaintiff's claims. Experts on standard of care are generally trained in your specialty. Experts in other specialties may be called on to review your case on causation (i.e., whether your care caused or contributed to the outcome).
